

Dr Benji Gyampoh and Scientific African win PROSE Award 2020

The Scientific African journal has won the "2020 Best New Journal in Science, Technology and Medicine" at the PROSE Awards 2020. Dr Benjamin Apraku Gyampoh of the Department of Fisheries and Watershed Management is the Founding Editor-in-Chief of the journal which started in April 2018. The PROSE (Professional and Scholarly Excellence) Awards are presented by the Association of American Publishers' (AAP) annually to recognize the very best in professional and scholarly publishing by bringing attention to distinguished books, journals, and electronic content. The winners were selected by a panel of 19 judges from 157 finalists identified from more than 630 entries in this year's PROSE Awards competition.
